#### I. STATE OPPORTUNITY ZONE APPLICATION RENEWAL:

Approval is requested to submit a State Opportunity Zone application (for renewal) to the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA). The Georgia Opportunity Zone is a tax credit program sponsored by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs. This is a program that offers state job tax credits based on job creation in low-to-moderate income areas. The intent is to help redevelop blighted areas in older neighborhoods or commercial corridors and to attract jobs.
